### **Who should apply for financial aid?**

Everyone should apply for financial aid. There are no set income limits, so do not assume that you are too poor or too wealthy to qualify for some type of aid. See "Applying for Financial Aid" for eligibility requirements and application procedures.

### **How does the application process work?**

After completing the FAFSA, results indicating your eligibility, as determined by the Department of Education, are sent to you and the college(s) of your choice. Additional documentation may be required for a complete file. The college uses the results to create a financial aid package for you.

### **Is one FAFSA enough for all of the schools I am considering?**

Only one FAFSA is needed and you can have the results sent to six colleges to determine your eligibility for financial aid.

### **What is needed to complete the FAFSA?**

You will need tax returns or estimates of tax information. Parents' tax information must also be reported unless the student is independent. See "Applying for Financial Aid". Please note that after submitting the FAFSA, it takes a few days for the Department of Education to process it and for the school(s) you selected to receive it.

### **By completing FAFSA, am I applying for all types of aid?**

By completing the FAFSA, you are applying for standard federal and state aid, including grants, loans, work-study and scholarships. Loans and scholarships may require additional applications.

### **Do I have to reapply every year?**

You need to reapply yearly between January 1 and April 1.

### **Can my parents have access my financial information at WTC?**

In order for a student's parents to access information regarding financial aid, the student must consent to release information by filling out a FERPA form.
